THE LORD'S SUPPER

WHAT IS IT?

On the night before Jesus' death, He shared this meal with His disciples. **The broken bread represents His body given to us. The cup represents His blood shed for us.** As disciples today, we observe the Lord's Supper in remembrance of what Christ did for us.



BIBLE STORY THE LAST SUPPER

And he took the cup, and when he had given thanks he said, “Take this, and divide it among yourselves. For I tell you that from now on I will not drink of the fruit of the vine until the kingdom of God comes.” And he took bread, and when he had given thanks, he broke it and gave it to them, saying, “This is my body, which is given for you. Do this in remembrance of me.” And likewise, the cup after they had eaten, saying, “This cup that is poured out for you is the new covenant in my blood.” - Luke 22:17-20

Remember the purpose of the cup: His blood shed - Take the juice.
